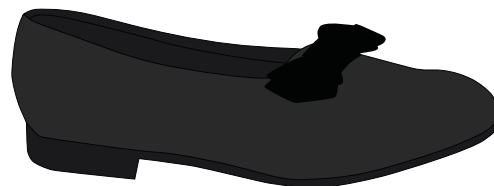

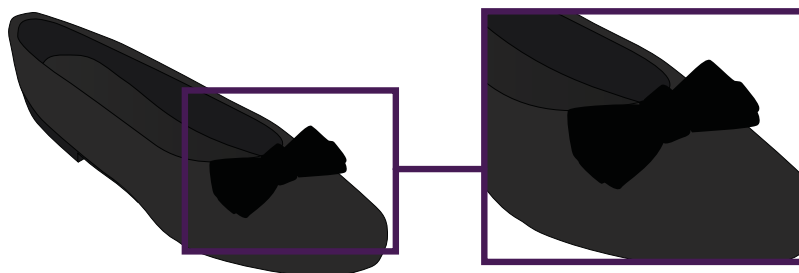
Bespoke Unit's Key Men's Opera Pump Facts

- Only worn with evening wear, its form is mostly unchanged since the 1800's



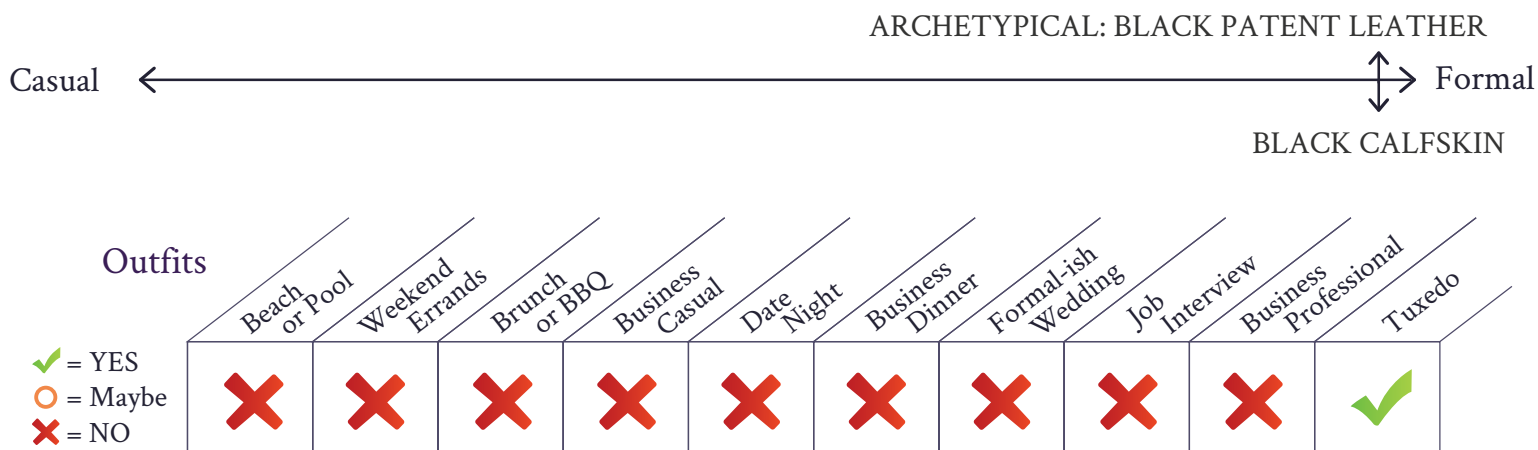
What Makes It An Opera Pump?
