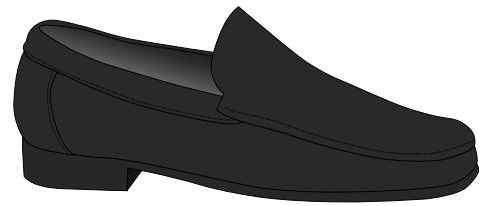
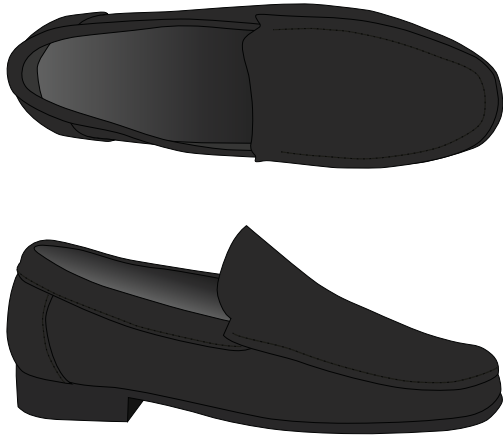

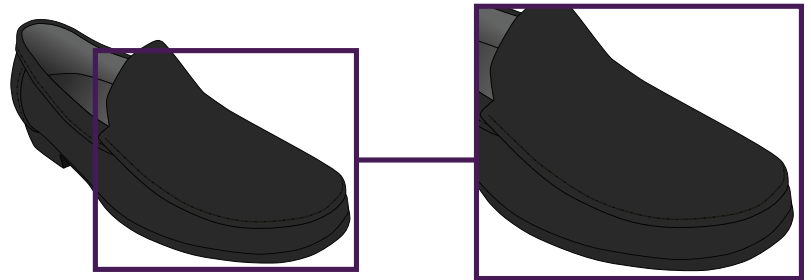
Bespoke Unit's Key Venetian Loafer Facts

What Makes It A Venetian?

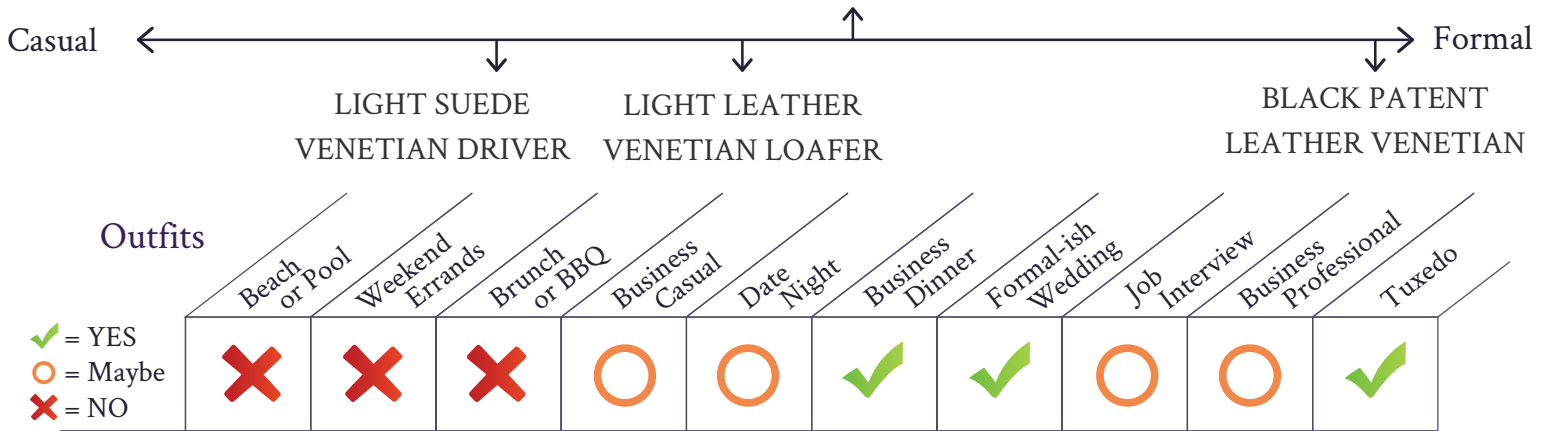
- A Venetian is a loafer that has a totally unadorned upper, free from saddles, buckles, bits, broguing, and laces

ARCHETYPICAL: BLACK OR BROWN LEATHER VENETIAN LOAFER



- A very versatile shoe, Venetians can be worn with anything from jeans to a tuxedo depending on color and material
- Can be made more casual in summertime with no-show socks or more formal in winter in darker colors with wool socks
